- (a)to (c) Government has released the National Action Plan on Climate Change (NAPCC) on June 30, 2008. NAPCC includes eight National Missions in specific areas of energy, habitat, water, agriculture, forests and Himalayan ecosystem. The progress of eight National Missions under National Action Plan on Climate Change (NAPCC) are being regularly monitored by the Executive Committee on Climate Change (ECCC) and Prime Minister's Council on Climate Change (PMCCC). Summary of the progress made under National Missions as on November, 2014 is given in Annexure.
- (d) & (e) Yes, Madam. The ECCC at its meeting held on November 14, 2014, decided that the achievements under the National Missions under NAPCC be evaluated and reviewed.
