STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF UNSTARRED QUESTION NO.3503 BY SHRI RAVNEET SINGH TO BE ANSWERED IN LOK SABHA ON 15.12.2014 REGARDING FREIGHT CHARGES

- (a)&(b) Railways have traditionally cross-subsidized passenger business through their freight business as a result of which Railway freight rates have increased regularly while passenger fares have stagnated. This has made Railway's freight business non-competitive vis-Ã -vis other modes of transport. In the recent Railway Budget, a beginning was made to correct these imbalances. With effect from 25.06.2014, therefore, the passenger fares of all classes, including Monthly Season Tickets was increased by 14.2%, inclusive of Fuel Adjustment Component (FAC) of 4.2% whereas the freight rates were increased by 6.5%, inclusive of FAC of 1.4%. The fare and freight revision so carried out was to correct the freight to fare ratio imbalance and improve it from 4.2 to 4.0.
- $(c)\&(d)\ Evaluation\ of\ various\ alternatives\ relating\ to\ rationalization\ of\ the\ fare\ and\ freight\ structures\ is\ an\ on\ -going\ process.$
