Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government proposes to establish a Central Armed Police Forces Institute of Medical Sciences (CAPFIMS) in the country and if so, the details thereof;

(b) the details of facilities likely to be provided in the said Institute;

(c) the total expenditure likely to be incurred for establi-shment of the Institute along with the details of funds allocated so far; and

(d) the time by which such Institute is likely to be started?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI KIREN RIJIJU)

(a) to (d): The Government has already approved establishment of a Central Armed Police Forces Institute of Medical Sciences (CAPFIMS), along with a 500-bed General Hospital, a 300-bed Super Specialty Hospital, a Nursing College and a School of Paramedics, at an estimated cost of Rs.1368.53 crore. Sanction order has been issued on 22.10.2013. This institute envisages to improve the health care facilities for the Central Armed Police Force personnel and their families and contribute to the overall improvement of the medical facilities available for the CAPFs, by producing doctors, paramedical staff and nurses, duly trained. A sum of Rs.1300.00 crore has been kept in the Gross Budgetary Support allocation for CAPFIMS in the 12th Five Year Plan (2012-13 to 2016-17). The completion schedule for the project is March 2017.
