- (a) the efforts made by the Kendriya Hindi Sansthan, Agra for the development of Hindi during the last three years;
- (b) the amount allocated and spent thereon for the purpose during the above period, year-wise;
- (c) the extent of funds surrendered together with the reasons therefor; and
- (d) the details of books/dictionaries etc. published during the above period for propagation of Hindi?

**Answer**

(a): Central Institute of Hindi, i.e. Kendriya Hindi Sansthan, Agra is an autonomous organization under the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India. During the last three year Kendriya Hindi Sansthan, Agra and its Regional Centres situated at Delhi, Hyderabad, Guwahati, Shillong, Mysore, Dimapur, Bhubaneswar and Ahmadabad, conducted various Hindi Certificate, Diploma and other Hindi Teaching courses under which 2791 students in 2011-12, 2505 students in 2012-13 and 3246 students in 2013-14 had taken admission for learning Hindi in the non Hindi speaking States in India as well as foreign countries. Apart from this 43 Seminars and 50 workshops, were organized by institute. Further, 12 projects and 120 Lectures on various subjects were also conducted by the Institute during the last three years.

(b): The detail of budget allocated and spent during the last three year is as under:-
