- (a) whether the information has since been collected;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (c) the steps taken or being taken by the Government to increase the representation of Minorities in the Police Force in the country?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI HARIBHAI PARATHIBHAI CHAUDHARY)

- (a): Yes, Madam.
- (b) As 'Police' and 'Law and Order' are State subjects, falling in Entry 1 and 2 of List II of the Seventh Schedule of the Constitution of India, no such statistics on representation of minorities in the State Police Forces are maintained by the Ministry of Home Affairs. The details of representation of minorities in Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) and Assam Rifles during 2004 to 2011 is at Annex.
- (c): Following efforts are made to increase the representation of the minorities in the CAPFs:
- (i) Recruitment to various posts in CAPFs is done on all India basis after giving wide publi- city in all leading newspaper, Employment News, internet etc. and copy of each recruitment advertisement is also sent to the Minorities Commission for its wide publicity amongst minority community.
- (ii) A minority member is included in the Selection Board for the Recruitment rallies.
