Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government has any new specific employment schemes for the tribals/ Scheduled Tribes in the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the various jobs provided to the tribals in the country including Rajasthan during the last three years and the current year, State/UT-wise;

(d) whether priority is given to tribals with regard to providing jobs in public sector undertakings also; and

(e) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI BANDARU DATTATREYA)

(a) & (b): Government has launched various employment generation programmes like Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) run by Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises, Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGA), Pt. DeenDayalUpadhyaya GrameenKaushalyaYojana (DDU-GKY) run by Ministry of Rural Development and National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM) run by Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation. The tribals and STs can avail the benefits under these schemes.

Government has decided to use at least 10% of Special Central Assistance to Tribal Sub-Plan (SCA-TSP).

The Ministry of Tribal Affairs implements the following schemes/ programmes to facilitate tribals to get employment:-

(i) Vocational Training in Tribal Areas to upgrade the skills of the tribal youth in various traditional/ modern vocations to gain suitable employment or enable themto become self-employed.

(ii) Schemes implemented by National Scheduled Tribes Finance and Development Corporation (NSTFDC) for self-employment of Scheduled Tribes by providing concessional financial assistance to individual or group of STs for undertaking income generation activities.

(iii) Activities undertaken by Tribal Co –Operative Marketing Development Federation of India Limited (TRIFED) imparting skill development and capacity building training to tribals Minor Forest Produce (MFP) gatherers and tribal artisans.

(iv) Under Forest Right Act 2006, individual and community right are recognized and vested to the Tribals and other traditional forest dwellers which, inter-alia, entitle them to collect and sell Minor Forest Produce (MFP) etc.

(v) Further, as a social security measure to MFP gatherers who are primarily Scheduled Tribes, a package of interventions through a Centrally Sponsored Scheme Marketing of Minor Forest Produce through Minimum Support Price and Development of Value Chain has been launched.

(vi) Scholarship schemes for professional education for STs facilitating them to get employed.

(c): Available details of State/ UT-wise number of jobs provided to tribals in the country including Rajasthan during 2009, 2010 & 2011 as per live register maintained in the Employment Exchanges is at Annex.

(d) & (e): Providing jobs to tribals in Public Sector Undertakings is a continuous process. Vacancies are filled up on an ongoing basis as per requirements of various departments/ public sector undertakings keeping in view the reservation policy of the government.
