COLLAPSE OF GLASS PANELS AT CHENNAI AIRPORT

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether many instances of collapse of glass panel as well as wall collapse/structural collapse have been repo- rted at new terminal of Chennai Airport;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Airports Authority of India (AAI) has taken any action against the company responsible for the repair and maintenance of this airport;
- (d) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (e) the steps taken by AAI to stop recurrence of such instances at the airport in future?

Answer

Minister of State in the Ministry of CIVIL AVIATION (Dr. Mahesh Sharma)

- (a) & (b): Yes, Madam. 15 instances of collapse of glass panels have been reported in the last one year against a total of 7052 glass panels at the new terminal of Chennai Airport. This works out to be 2.12 instances per 1000, which is below the glass industry reported cases of 8-10 instances per 1000, during the initial period of installation.
- (c), (d) & (e): The agency has replaced all the broken glasses. The Airports Authority of India (AAI) has entrusted IIT Madras to carry out investigation. AAI has also engaged IIT Madras as a consultant for analyzing the design and quality of the material of the structural glazing at Chennai Airport. As an interim mea- sure, AAI has created stainless steel guard to prevent the access of travelling public and workmen to the glass walls. AAI has also taken steps to provide canopy on air-side and SS railing on the city side to prevent any injury to passengers.
