## Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FORESTS AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

(a) whether the environmental impact assessment report on the proposed atomic power plant near Gujarat's South Saurasthra coast has found lack of clarity on several issues;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether the farmers` of Bhavnagar district of Gujarat have strongly protested such move of the Government to set up power plant; and

(d) if so, the reaction of the Government thereto?

## Answer

(a) & (b) The Environmental Impact Assessment Report/Environment Management Plan (EIA/EMP) submitted by Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL) for the Gujarat Atomic Park (6x1,000 MWe) at Village Jaspara, District Bhavnagar, Gujarat, has been considered in the Expert Appraisal Committee (EAC) (Nuclear) for the grant of Environment Clearance (EC) under the provisions of Environment Impact Assessment Notification, 2006 in its 17th meeting held on 06.05.2014. The EAC (Nuclear), have asked NPCIL to revise the EIA/EMP Report.

(c) & (d) Yes Sir. The Ministry has received representations from various NGOs /individuals against the setting up of the said nuclear power project, which have been duly considered by the EAC (Nuclear) in the meeting held on 06.05.2014. The EAC (Nuclear), after examining the comments, have directed NPCIL to submit their comments/clarifi- cations along with the commitments made to public, if any, with budget provisions for implementing the same.
