- (a) & (b) As per the data collected by the United States Department of Energy's Carbon Dioxide Information Analysis Center (CDIAC) for the United Nations, India's total carbon dioxide emissions is 20,08,823.0 kilo tonnes in 2010 and India is ranking third at global level.
- (c) to (e) India does not have legally binding reduction commitments under Kyoto Protocol. However, Government of India is taking steps voluntarily to reduce Green House Gas emissions through the implementation of National Missions namely, National Solar Mission, National Mission on Enhanced Energy Efficiency, Green India Mission and National Mission on Sustainable Habitat under National Action Plan on Climate Change during the 12th Five Year Plan.
