(a), (b) & (c) Many tiger reserves already have natural forest / topographical linkages, owing to natural geog- raphical disposition. The National Tiger Conservation Authority / Project Tiger has issued guidelines for restoration of such linkages in tiger reserve specific Tiger Conservation Plan as required under section 38V of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972. This is an 'inclusive strategy' to benefit local people and wild animals including the tiger.
