Title: Need for excavation by Archaeological Survey of India in Malda, Uttar and Dakshin Dinajpur districts, West Bengal.

SHRI PRIYA RANJAN DASMUNSI (RAIGANJ): Sir, Malda, Uttar and Dakshin Dinajpur districts of West Bengal are the rich treasures of ancient history which could only be revealed through comprehensive Archaeological Survey's work and excavation. Signs of the Golden age of 'Pundara Vardhana' and 'Varendra Bhoomi' spread over the undivided districts of Dinajpur and Malda writ large in the areas like Raniganj, Rasakhoa, Asuragarh, Baje Bindol, Bangarh, Tapan, Fakirdighi, Gouri, Hemtabad, Kasba-Mahaso, Karandighi, Mahipaldighi, Panchanagar, Patiraj and Radhikapur of Uttar and Dakshin Dinajpur, comprising of Raiganj, Kaliaganj, Itahar, Kushmandi, Karandighi etc. In early thirties, Calcutta University undertook excavations at Bangarh which found to be very fruitful.
