Title: Need to control and prevent Cervical Cancer among women.

SHRIMATI APARUPA PODDAR (ARAMBAG): Cervical cancer is the most common cancer among Indian women and number one reason for causing death of women in India. Cervical cancer generally strikes women at the age of 35 years and reaches a peak between 55 and 64 years. This cancer is curable by preventive treatment and vaccination. Over 100 countries gained inmunisation against cervical cancer. In India, there is an urgent need for initiation of community screening education programmes for the control and prevention of cervical cancer in rural, tribal and backward regions of India.
