Title: Regarding framing a policy for reserved constituencies.

PROF. A.S.R. NAIK (MAHABUBABAD): The primary objective of the reservation in our country is to fill the gap between poor and rich by enhancing their socio-economic and educational status empowering the oppressed, suppressed and underprivileged communities and ultimately bring them on par with others. For instance, the Union Government has taken away seven mandals without any intimation to concerned MLA and MP of concerned mandals. Our purpose of election from reserved constituency got defeated. On the other side, there are criticisms from various sections of society that all the benefits are being enjoyed by reserved people. But unfortunately any special policy, allocation of extra funds, infrastructure, educational institutions, health centres are not being provided in reserved constituencies.
