Title: Need to review the decision to reduce allocation of funds on social sector.

SHRI MULLAPPALLY RAMCHANDRAN (VADAKARA): Madam, thank you very much for having given me this opportunity. I wish to draw the kind attention of this House to a very important matter relating to social-sector expenditure.

It has been widely reported that the Government of India has decided to cut expenditure in social-sector drastically in the coming financial year.
