Title: Regarding including Rajahmundry Citry under HRIDAY (National Heritage Development and Augmentation Yojana) Scheme.

SHRI M. MURLI MOHAN (RAJAHMUNDRY): Of late, the Union Government has launched HRIDAY (National Heritage City Development and Augmentation Yojana) covering 12 cities in various parts of the country.

In this context, I would like to make a humble submission before the Union Government that Rajahmundry is one of the major cities in the State of Andhra Pradesh located on the banks of the river Godavari in East Godavari District. In its earlier days, it was called 'Rajamahendravaram'. It is a historical city famous for its political, agricultural, literary, economic, social and cultural background.
