**UPGRADATION PHCS AND CHCS**

**1876. SHRI KONAKALLA NARAYANA RAO:  
SHRI J.C. DIVAKAR REDDY:  
SHRIMATI KOTHAPALLI GEETHA:**

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has any proposal to upgrade all Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and Community Health Centres (CHCs) to cater to the needs of the patients 24X7 and if so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise including Andhra Pradesh;
- (b) whether there is acute shortage of basic amenities including Doctors, nurses and medicines in PHCs and CHCs in the country including Andhra Pradesh and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether hospitals in Andhra Pradesh meant for 24 hours are not properly working due to insufficient/shortage of staff and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the steps taken/being taken by the Government to upgrade PHCs and CHCs?

**ANSWER  
THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND  
FAMILY WELFARE  
(SHRI ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY)**

(a): Public Health and hospitals being a State Subject, the primary responsibility of providing health care services to the citizens including upgrading Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and Community Health Centres (CHCs) to cater to the needs of the patients 24X7, lies with the respective State/UT Governments. However, Under National Health Mission (NHM), support is extended to States/UTs to strengthen their healthcare system for provision of accessible, affordable and quality health care to all the citizens based on proposals submitted by the States / UTs in their Programme Implementation Plans.

As reported by the govt. of Andhra Pradesh, the state has recently upgraded twelve PHCs/ CHCs. The details are given at Annexure-1.

The details of PHCs /CHCs functioning on 24X7 basis, State/UT-wise, is given at Annexure –II.

(b): As per Rural Health Statistics 2017, there is shortage of basic amenities including Doctors and nurses in PHCs and CHCs in the country including Andhra Pradesh. The details are placed at Annexure-III to Annexure-IX.

No specific cases of acute shortage of medicine in PHCs and CHCs have come to the notice of this Ministry.

(c): The State has informed that hospitals meant for 24 hours are working properly. However, steps are being taken to create new posts as well as to fill vacant posts.

(d): Public Health and hospitals being a State Subject, the primary responsibility of providing health care services to the citizens including upgrading all Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and Community Health Centres (CHCs) to cater to the needs of the patients 24X7, lies with the respective State/UT Governments.

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has prepared the guidelines for operationalizing a PHC for providing 24 hours delivery & new born care so as to assist the States to plan operationalizing 24 hours PHCs. To select a potential 24 hour PHC, a scoring system has been developed which can be used to prepare the priority list in the districts. States /UTs are to include their proposals in their Programme Implementation Plans. Approvals are given in accordance with the Gap Analysis, population norms and case load in the facilities of the State as decided in the National Programme Coordination Committee (NPCC) meetings, within the resource envelope available for particular State/UT.
