Assessment of Gram Panchayats

1048. SHRI PRALHAD JOSHI:

Will the Minister of PANCHAYATI RAJ be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Ministry has decided to introduce mark sheets based assessment system for Gram Panchayats to assess their performance;
- (b) if so, the parameters on the basis of which gram panchayats are likely to be assessed; and
- (c) the steps proposed to be taken on the underperforming gram panchayats under this assessment system?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PANCHAYATI RAJ (SHRI PARSHOTTAM RUPALA)

(a) to (c) Ministry of Panchayati Raj (MoPR) has formulated the scheme for disbursal of Performance Grants (PG) under the Fourteenth Finance Commission (FFC) award for the period 2017-18 to 2019-20. The scheme has four mandatory criteria, namely, submission of audited accounts, increase in Own Source Revenue (OSR), preparation of Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) and display of sector-wise expenditure in FFC Dashboard of the Ministry. The evaluation criterion also contains factors on Open Defecation Free (ODF) Status and Immunisation Status. The copy of the PG Scheme is enclosed at **Annexure**.

The performance grants will be released to the Gram Panchayats (GP) based on the overall score obtained by them as per the scheme. Those Gram Panchayats which perform better by obtaining score of 50 or more would get additional amount from the undistributed amount to further incentivize them. GPs not fulfilling mandatory conditions, will not get performance grants. GPs fulfilling mandatory conditions and getting score 49 or less than 49 will get 50% of performance grants.

Further, MoPR invites online nominations every year from interested GPs of all States/UTs of the country for Deen Dayal Upadhyay Panchayat Sashaktikaran Puraskar and Nanaji Deshmukh Rashtriya Gaurav Gram Sabha Puraskar. A set of criteria, indicators, questionnaire and marking scheme to be adopted by the States/UTs for assessing the GPs have been developed by MoPR in consultation with State/UTs. The GPs are selected for awards by MoPR on the basis of recommendations received from respective States/UTs.

Evaluation criteria for disbursal of FFC Performance Grant (PG) to Gram Panchayats (GPs) for 2017-18 to 2019-20

1. All the GPs have to mandatorily fulfil the following conditions to be eligible for consideration of allocation of share of Performance Grant-

3. Distribution of Performance Grants to GPs-

PG distribution to GPs based on their score shall be made as per details given in the following table:

Score	Eligible Quantum of PG
upto 49	50 % of Allocation
50 upto 60	70 % of Allocation
61 upto 70	80 % of Allocation
71 and above	100% of Allocation

4. Any undistributed amount, after the above allocations as per para-3 including those of ineligible GPs, will be redistributed only amongst GPs scoring 50 or above proportionately on the basis of weighted average of the score obtained by the GP with respect to the overall weightage.
