3769. SHRI MADHAV RAO PATIL: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether attention of the Government has been drawn to the news-item captioned 'Power to Win' appearing in India Today dated May 25, 1998 at page 73 regarding irregularities/misuse of public fund in Indian Hockey Federation;

(b) if so, the action taken by the Government against IHF;

(c) whether any special audit of accounts of IHF by Comptroller and Auditor General has been ordered;

(d) if so, the details thereof; and

(e) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT (KUMARI UMA BHARATI): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. The Govt. has come across the news item captioned 'Power to Win' which appeared in India Today of May, 25 1998. The Indian Hockey Federation (IHF) was asked to explain the position. IHF has indicated that as regards allegations made in the News item there is no irregularity and the annual accounts of IHF for the years 1995-96, 1996-97 and 1997-1998, duly certified by Chartered Accountant have been placed in Annual General Meeting held on 10.5.98.

(c) to (e) This Dept. has not asked for any special audit of accounts of IHF by Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG). However, as indicated by IHF, Internal Audit & Inspection Wing of this Ministry will take up audit of accounts of IHF next month. If any irregularity is pointed out by them, action will be taken as per law.
