THE MINISTER OF POWER, MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND MINISTER OF NON-CONVENTIONAL ENERGY SOURCES (SHRI P.R. KUMARAMANGALAM): (a) Lignite resources have been found in Barmer, Bikaner, and Nagaur districts of Rajasthan.

Tatkal Scheme for LPG Connection

1051. SHRI K.C. KONDAIAH: Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Tatkal Scheme for LPG in Karnataka has been revived;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the number of consumers provided LPG connections under this scheme till date;

(d) the total amount of non refundable received;

(e) whether the domestic LPG connections issued under Tatkal Scheme are being misused for commercial purpose; and

(f) if so, the steps taken by the Government in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS AND THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR): (a) and (b) The Tatkal Scheme was revived all over the country including the State of Karnataka with the Government approval of the LPG enrolment plan for 1998-99 in Sept., 1998. As per the directive of the Govt., 10% of the total new enrolment is earmarked for release of connection under Tatkal scheme.

(c) and (d) PSU Oil Companies have released 73,503 connections under Tatkal scheme in the State of Karnataka, since the introduction of the scheme till 31.12.98 and collected Rs. 29.44 crores as non-refundable amount for connections released under Tatkal scheme in the State of Karnataka.

(e) and (f) PSU Oil Companies have not come across with specific instances of domestic LPG connections issued under Tatkal Scheme being misused for commercial purpose. Oil Industry has an established system of checking diversion of domestic cylinders to commercial purpose through the field officers by conducting inspections and raids at distributors as well as at commercial premises.
