(a) to (c) Government of India have drawn the following Central Sector Schemes for augmenting production of vegetable crops:—

- (i) Integrated Development of Vegetables including Root & Tuber Crops with an outlay of Rs. 75.00 crores.
- (ii) Integrated Development of Onion Potato with an outlay of Rs. 49.48 crore. Both the schemes envisage to boost the production by providing improved hybrid seeds/quality planting material, laying out demonstration plots, providing training facilities, farm equipments & implements and on-farm cold storage facilities to the vegetable growers of the country.
- (d) The Government of India, through Agricultural & Processed Food Products Export Development Authority

(APEDA) has proposed to promote vegetable export by implementing following schemes/programmes:

- (i) Integrated Programme for Pre and Post Harvest Management.
- (ii) Preparation of Manuals.
- (iii) Promotion of Pack House Concept.
- (iv) Vapour Heat Treatment Experiment.
- (v) Controlled Atmosphere/Modified Atmosphere Experiments for Transportation.
- (vi) Infrastructure facilities.

Cycles of Onion Crops
