- 34. SHRL PRITHVIRAJ D. CHAVAN: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the University Grants Commission (UGC) has formulated a Guest Teacher Scheme for teachers posted in border States; and
 - (b) if so, the main features of the scheme?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT, MINISTER OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AND MINISTER OF DEPARTMENT OF OCEAN DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI): (a) and (b) The UGC has not formulated any "Guest Teacher Scheme". However, it has created a few positions of visiting faculty in the Universities since 1990-91 to provide teaching/research assignments to teachers from Kashmir University and its affiliated colleges. It has been decided to continue the scheme upto 31st March, 2000 or till such time the position in Kashmir valley normalises. These visiting positions are classified into categories 'A'. 'B' and 'C' carrying a consolidated honorarium at the rate of Rs. 2,500/- per month, Rs. 3,000/- per month and Rs. 4,000/- per month respectively. These teachers continue to draw their salaries from their respective Universities/Colleges in addition to the above honorarium.

MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI): (a) 3598 historical monuments and sites are protected by the Archaeological Survey of India. State-wise break-up is given in statement-I attached.

(b) The total allocation made by the Government for the upkeep and development of these monuments and sites during the years 1995-96, 1996-97 and 1997-98, State-wise, is given in statement-II attached.
