- (a) whether the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) is having any proposal to clean the other towers at the entrance of Brihadiswara Temple (Big Temple) at Thanjavur and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether it is a fact that ASI has undertaken strengthening of floors to maintain sturdiness of the sub-surface structure of the temple;
- (c) if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) whether it will affect the thousand years old temple's foundation and if so, the details thereof?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PART (a) TO (d) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. *190 FOR 24.12.2018.

- (a) Yes Madam. There are three towers at the entrance of Brihadiswara Temple, known as Big Temple, Thanjavur. These towers are Maratha gate, Keralanthagan Gopuram and Rajarajan Gopuram. All these three entrance towers are scientifically cleaned and preserved recently and they are in a good state of preservation. For other locations in the temple complex necessary scientific cleaning and preservation work is attended as per requirements.
- (b) Yes Madam. Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) has strengthened the
- & damaged and worn out brick flooring on the southern, western and northern
- (c) side of the temple by removal of decayed bricks and replacing the same with new bricks, laid over the base concrete.
- (d) No Madam. The conservation work of flooring of the temple will not affect its foundation.
