SHRI HARISH RAWAT (Almora) : Mr. Speaker, Sir, if certain things of the Resolution had not have a political motive, then it would have been easier for a person like me to extend support to it. I am not concerned about whatever the hon. Member has stated with political intentions. I want to concentrate only on those points which are connected with our economic system, especially our industrial policy. It would have been appropriate if the Resolution had been addressed to our hon. Minister of Industries, because almost all the issues are connected with our Industrial Policy Resolution. I think the hon. Minister of Planning can reply to the main points. But the details to which the hon. Member wanted to draw the attention of the Government should be replied to by the hon. Minister of Industries. We have agreed that the basic principles should be Growth, Social Justice, Equality and Equal Distribution of Wealth.
