STATEMENT RE. SIEGE OF INDIAN
EMBASSY IN MEXICO

THE MINISTER OF LAW, JUSTICE AND COMPANY AFFAIRS (SHRI P. SHIV SHANKAR): Sir, on behalf of the Minister of External Affairs, I beg to make the following statement.

As hon. Members may have heard, our Mission and the Guatemalan Mission in Mexico City were occupied at about 0130 hours Indian Standard Time by a group of Mexican Indians. It is believed that they were protesting against the arrest of one of their leaders by the Government of Mexico. They probably wanted our Embassy to intercede with the Mexican Government on their behalf, considering our close and friendly relations with Mexico. However, they assured our Embassy officials that it was not their intention to treat our Embassy people as hostages or to harm them.

The siege was lifted at about 0600 hours Indian Standard Time with the

co-operation of the local Government authorities. All our officers and staff are safe. There was no violence.
