OBITUARY REFERENCES

MR. SPEAKER : I have to inform the House of the sad demise of Shri D. Kamakshaiah, a sitting Member and Shri Tribhuvan Narain Singh, a former Member of this House.

Shri D. Kamakshaiah was a sitting Member representing Nellore constituency of Andhra Pradesh. Earlier he had been a Member of the Fifth and Sixth Lok Sabha during 1971—79. He was a Member of the Committee on Private Members' Bills and Resolutions. He also had been a Member of Committee on the Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and Consultative Committee on Shipping and Transport during 1972—74 and 1977—79 respectively.

He was taken ill suddenly while travelling along with his family members by G.T. Express. He was attended to by the Railway doctor at Kazipet and removed to Mahatma Gandhi Memorial Medical College Hospital, Warangal by the doctor. He was accompanied by his family members. He passed away at about midnight of 3rd/4th August, 1982.

An active social worker, he engaged himself in the welfare of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.

Shri Tribhuvan Narain Singh was a Member of the Provisional Parliament First and Second Lok Sabha representing Banaras District (East) and Chandauli Constituency of Uttar Pradesh respectively during 1950—58. Subsequently he was member of Rajya Sabha during 1965—76.

A renowned journalist and a veteran freedom fighter, he participated in the freedom struggle and suffered imprisonment several times.

He was Chairman of Public Accounts Committee from 1957-58, having been a Member thereof earlier. He was a Member of the Planning Commission and was also associated with several Committees/Commissions of the Government of India namely, Press Commission, Grow-More-Food Enquiry Committee and Administrative Reforms Commission etc.

As a Minister in the Central Government during 1964—67, he held various portfolios. He was Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh for about six months during 1970-71. He was Governor of West Bengal from 1977 to 1981.
