(a) whether there was anomaly in the pay scales of Senior Stenographers and Hindi Assistants employed in the Water Supply and Sewage Disposal Undertaking in the Delhi Municipal Corporation as compared to the employees of the same category employed in the general Wing;

(b) if so, whether the anomaly has been removed and the employees concerned are getting the benefit thereof;

(c) if not, the reasons for the delay in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MURASOLI MARAN): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c). Delhi Administration and Delhi Water Supply & Sewage Disposal Undertaking have reported the decision has already been taken to revise the pay scales and the Recruitment Rules of the Senior Stenographers and Hindi Assistants in the Undertaking to fall in line with those in the General Wing of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi.
