vacancies in the Grade of Administrative Officers in Kendriva Vidvalava Sarigathan. In Accordance with the Recruitment Rules for the post of Administrative Officer in Kendriva Vidvalava Sangathan, 50% posts are to be filled by promotion, failing which by transfer on deputation and 50% by deputation. The four current vacancies fall to the share of the deputationinsts. As per the existing instructions of the Government of India, Deputationists to Central Autonomous Bodies are required to be taken on permanent absorption basis for which the willing candidates are not forthcoming. The Matter is under consideration to overcome this difficulty.

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## Construction of Advanced Light Helicopter by H.A.L.

7739. SHRI MADHAVRAO SCINDIA: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:
