Trans. Exodus of Refugees from Bangladesh to Tripura 130/2/11

*53. SHRI BAJU BAN RIYAN: SHRI T. DAMODAR REDDY:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) where Government are aware that the tribals in Tripura are excited over the exodus of refugees Bangladesh to Tripura;
- (b) if so, the number of refugees and causes thereof; and
- (c) the steps taken by Government in this matter?

THE MINISTRY OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA); (a) and (b). There have been no such reports. However, it is a fact that nearly 17,215 tribals from Chittagong Hill Tracts in Bangladesh crossed over to Tripura since 27th June, 1981. According to their statements, this exodus resulted from clashes between local tribal groups and non-tribal settlers supported by some local authorities in Bangladesh.

(c) The matter was taken up with the Government of Bangladesh who have agreed to take back refugees. It is proposed to start repatriation from 25th November, 1981 onwards.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) and (b). Recruitment Rules for Central Secretariat Official Language Services (Group 'C' posts) i.e. relating to Hindi Translators have been notified in the Gazette of India 19-9-81. Recruitment Rules for the posts of Hindi Officer and above have not yet been finalised.

(c) Instructions have been that such persons as are working on deputation/ad-hoc basis against posts being included in the Central Secretariat Official Language Service and whose services are found satisfactory, may be allowed, where necessary with the concurrence of the Union Public Service Commission, to be retained in their respective posts till the formation of the Central Secretariat Official Language Service or December, 1981, whichever is earlier. They may not be reverted to their parent office/substantive posts merely because their period of deputation has expired.

Acquisition of Latest War Equipments by Pakistan

*55. SHRI P. NAMGYAL:

SHRÎ P. RAJAGOPAL NAIDU:

Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the U.S.A. and Pakistan are reported to have reached an agreement to supply Pakistan 200 F-16 war planes besides latest models of tanks, naval warships, submarines, armoured personnel carriers, surface to air missiles, air to air

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missiles, anti aircraft guns, 155 MM field guns, Mayvericks, cluster bombs, night fighting equipments etc. worth 3.6 billion dollars;

- (b) if so, the details and number of . such war equipments along with the expected date of delivery country; and
- (c) what steps Government propose to take to counter Pakistan's acquisition of the latest war equipments?

THE PRIME MINISTER (SHRI-MATI INDIRA GANDHI): (a) Available information indicates that negotiations on the US-Pakistan arms deal have recently been finalised. deal is reported to include the supply of tanks, armoured personnel carriers, aircraft, helicopters, artillery, defence systems, anti-tank weapons, destroyers and naval missile.

- (b) We have no definite information on the details and number of such equipment. It is reported that some items of equipment are to be delivered shortly, the supply of others is likely to be effected over the next five years.
- (c) Government have initiated appropriate measures to ensure adequate defence preparedness. It would not be desirable to disclose details.
