## Historical Monuments in Jammu and Kashmir

\*477. SHRI P. NAMGYAL: Will the Minister of EDUCATION AND SO-CIAL WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that hundred year old monuments of great historical value are languishing in neglect at (i) villages Bupnergarh, Dir Garh and Mahore Garh of Tehsil Samba of Jammu District; (ii) temple of village Beli Tehsil and District Udhampur; (iii) temple of Jullundra Devi in Village Kotli Pain, Tehsil Chenani of District Udhampur; and

(b) whether Government propose to get these monuments inspected and preserved through the Archaeological Survey of India?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRIMATI SHEILA KAUL): (a) and (b). According to the information available with Government these monuments should be in charge of the State Government and they should take care of these monuments unless it is established that some of these monuments are of national importance—Government is awaiting the report from the local officers.

SHRI P. NAMGYAL: Sir what are criteria fixed for declaring a particular monument as of national importance? You have said that Government is awaiting the report from the local officers. May I know whether those officers are of Central Government or of State Government?

SHRIMATI SHEILA KAUL: The ancient and historical monuments which are more than 100 years old and of outstanding archaeological, historical and architectural merit are alone considered for declaration as of national importance under the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains Act and the Superintendent, Archaeology, North Eastern Circle, has been deputed to

go into the work and when we get his report we will be able to do something about it.

SHRI P. NAMGYAL: know Whether the Government aware of the fact that Kashmir Government is destroying many of the ancient monuments particularly of the Dogra period which are more than 100 years old like the Chashma Shahi and Nishet Bagh in Srinagar and also the belief that the State Assembly building which was former palace of the Dogra King (Raja and) some other buildings according some, have also been set on fire by the agents of the Kashmir Government? What steps are Government of India taking to protect these similar monuments?

SHRIMATI SHEILA KAUL: We are not aware of what has been said here.

DR. KARAN SINGH: Mr. Speaker, Sir, my friend, Mr. Namgyal, has drawn attention to the wanton destruction that is taking place of the archaeological heritage in Jammu and Kashmir. Like the other States India, Jammu and Kashmir is very rich in archaeology-in Ladakh, in the Valley and in Jammu But, over the last four or five years, a number of important historical landmarks have been deliberately destroyed. In the Nishat Garden, you will remember, there was the canopy which was built in Shahjahan's times and it seems that the present Mughals do not like it. Therefore, one day they aid, 'You remove the canopy'. That is an outrage Similarly, the Sher-Garhi palace-which was a monument in itself, I am not saying it because it was my family it was not, it had already been given to the State before independence, it was a monument, the apiermache ceilings of that Place were unique,was burnt down. There is a deliberate policy, we feel, of destroying these ancient monuments, and Minister says that she is not aware of this. May I respectfully enquire-

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from the Minister, from the Government, whether they are aware that the Frime Minister knows about this problem, and what steps are Government of India going to take to see that whatever is left in Jammu & Kashmir State is also not destroyed?

Oral Answers

SHRIMATI SHEILA KAUL: All these monuments are supposed to be under the State...

DR. KARAN SINGH: That is not true, Madam.

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI S. B. CHAVAN): In the light of the question put by Dr. Karan Singh, Government would like to have the information. As far as our information is concerned, neither the Suprintendent of Archaeology has reported this mater to us, nor has the Jammu & Kashmir Government reported anything. (Interruptions) Certainly we cannot possibly say whether the Jammu & Kashmir Government responsible for destruction of property, of this ancient monument, unless we have authentic about it. Certainly we shall have the information; we would like inquire into the entire thing.

DR. KARAN SINGH: Would you send the Director-General of Archaeology specially to Jammu & Kashmir to survey the position and report to you?

SHRI S. B. CHAVAN: First of all, we should get a report. We have not received a complaint either. If we get a report and if we find that there is a prima facie case, certainly the Director-General can be sent.
