Removal of Rural Poverty

*761. SHRI ARJUN SETHI: Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOP-MENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the problem of rural poverty can be solved through the presently operating employment generating scheme in rural areas;
 - (b) if so, the outlines thereof; and
- (c) whether the rural C. D. blocks in the country are not sufficiently equipped with expertise to dovetail the scheme in consonance with the needs of the people and or its implementation?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRIES OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI BALESHWAR RAM): (a) and (b). The Ministry of Rural Development is implementing the programmes of (i) Integrated Rural Development Programme (IRDP), (ii) National Scheme of Training of Rural Youth for Self Employment (TRYSEM) and (iii) National Rural Employment Programme (NREP) for maximising the employment opportunities in the rural areas and raising the income level of the identified target groups.

(c) The set up of the block machinery differs from State to State. Wherever the blocks are not sufficiently equipped with necessary expertise to carry out the schemes, the Government of India have offered 50 per cent assistance to State Governments for strengthening of block level administration.

- Increasing cropping intensity in irrigated and rainfed areas.
- 7. Transfer of technology through the newly re-organised extension system of Training and Visits.
- 8. A number of Central Sector and Centrally Sponsored Schemes are being implemented for increasing food production.
