talks unless and until there is a genuine change of heart of these gentlemen and their Government towards our own Government and people?

SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI: This is the whole point of the talks which the Foreign Secretary had there and which we had with them. We have spoken up very strongly about the anti-Indian speeches, statements in Pakistan and by their people elsewhere. That is why agreements had not been reached. Unless there is an atmosphere conducive to agreements, in which we know that such agreements will be effective and will be implemented properly, you cannot have them. That is why we give priority to an agreement for peace, friendship and cooperation. That is the very base. If that is decided upon and agreed to, then, automatically we can proceed a better relationship.

Visit of US Vice-President

*153. SHRI N. DENNIS: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that the Vice-President of U.S.A. had recently been on an official visit to India;

(b) if so, whether any voice was raised by India regarding U.S. Arms supply to **Pakistan and their assurance that it will not** be utilized against India, in view of our past experience; and

(c) if so, the outcome of the talks?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI A.A. RAHIM): (a) Yes, Sir; the the Vice President paid an official visit to India from the 12th to the 15th May.

(b) and (c) Government of India's strong concern over the massive supply of sophisticated arms by the United States to Pakistan was reiterated to the Vice President on more than one occasion.

SHRI N. DENNIS : Sir, from press reports, it is seen that the US Vice President declined to give an assurance that US arms to Pakistan would not be used against India, by merely saying that it is not directed against India, citing wrong comparisons about our arms purchase from other countries and using Afghanistan as an alibi. So, that means Pakistan is free to use these arms against any country including India and that is our past experience. May I know whether this denial could be taken as an advance caution that the intention of US administration is encirclement or destacilisation of this country, which is a potential threat to our peace and security ?

THE PRIME MINISTER (SHRIMATI INDIR'A GANDHI) : Sir, I cannot say that this is the intention of the United States Administration But it is true that we are deeply concerned over the induction of sophisticated weapons on a maasive scale in our neighbourhood and in the Indian Ocean as a whole. Specially because most of the armed forces and weapons are still on our border. We have no doubt that they are not going to be used against any other country. We have taken this up with the Government of the United States on many occasions. Their excuse, as the Hon. House knows, is that the situation in Afghanistan, compels them to give these arms. But as I have said, the guns are not pointing in that direction at all. Pakistan is taking the fullest advantgge of the situation in Afghanistan so as to try and get more and more help. And all this is increasing tension in our area.

SHRI N. DENNIS : May I know whether the concern expressed to him by our country regarding the arms aid to Pakistan would result in any change or modification in the Indo-Pakistan relations and also whether India sought the assistance of U.S. for bringing about normalization in this region. What is the positive achievement for our country, as a result of the visit of Mr. Bush ?

SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI : I have alearedy said that the induction of these sophisticated weapons has increased the tension, has vitiated the atmosphere. We were trying to create an atmosphere of friendship, but this has vitiated it. It has also imposed a very heavy burden on us, because we cannot afford to be negligent of our own defence. All this was pointed out to Vice President Bush, as well as at different levels of U.S. Government. But there has been little appreciation there of these concerns of ours.

श्री राम विलास पासवान : अध्यक्ष जी, जव अमरीका के उप-राष्ट्रपति आये थे उस समय में पेपर्स में निकला था कि दोनों देशों के नेताओं में बातचीत काफी हद तक अच्छी रही। तो मैं सरकार से जानना चाहता हूं कि जहां सरकार विदेशी हाथ का इस्तेमाल करती है प्रत्येक चीज में वहां सरकार का जो मतलब है बह सी. आई. ए. से भी होता है। तो क्या सरकार ने उप-राष्ट्रपति से इस सम्बन्ध में जिक किया था कि हिन्दुस्तान के आन्तरिक मामले में सी.आई.ए. का दखल होता है ? और यदि हां, तो उस पर सरकार की क्या प्रतिक्रिया है ? और मैं प्रधानमंत्री जी से जानना चाहता हूं कि अभी उन्होंने पढ़ा होगा जो एस. गोपाल हैं, श्री राधाकृष्णन के लड़के, उन्होंने रहस्योद्घाटन किया है। डा.एस.ओ. मथाई के सम्बन्ध में कि इनका भी सम्बन्ध सी.आई.ए. से रहा है। इस सम्बन्ध में आपने कोई जांच कराई है ? यदि हां, तो क्या है ?

श्रीमती इन्दिरा गांधी : जहां तक ताल्लुक है आपके आखिरी प्रश्न का जहां तक मुफे मालूम है कोई जांच अभी नहीं हुई है। उस वक्त उनके खिलाफ कुछ दूसरे आरोप लगे थे और उसमें जरूर जांच हुई थी। और यही कारण था कि वह हटाये गये थे।

जहां तक आपने बातचीत का जिक्र किया है तो अब बातचीत जब ऐसे लोग आते हैं तो हमेशा ही फ्रोन्क और फ्रोन्डली, यह दो शब्द हैं, जो हमेशा ही कहे जाते हैं और बातचीत उस स्तर पर होती भी है। यानी उनसे हम कोई लड़ाई तो करते नहीं हैं जो बातचीत करने आये हैं। लेकिन बहुत से विषय ऐसे होते हैं जिसमें हमारी राय वहुत ही डायमीट्रिवली अपोज्ड भी होती है, कभी थोड़ा फर्क होता है और वह हम जाहिर कर देते हैं। और हम समफते हैं कि इसमें कुछ लाभ है कि वह जाने हमारी क्या राय है। वह माने या नहीं यह दूसरी बात है। लेकिन यह जरूरी है कि वह हमसे जाने, क्योंकि कभी-कभी यह होता है कि अगर हम गुल नहीं मचा रहे हैं तो स्वीकार कर लिया कि यह चीज ठीक है। इसलिये घड़ी-घड़ी हमें बताना होता है कि हमारा असेसमेंट यह है, यह हो रहा है।

मगर माननीय सदस्य ने एक बड़ी अजब चीज ऐसी कही है कि ---

Government has used the foreign hand. Government has not used any foreign hand.

SHRI RAM VILAS PASWAN : Government had alleged that there was a foreign hand, viz. of C.I.A.

श्रीमती इन्दिरा गांधी : आपने कहा गवर्नमेंट ने इस्तेमाल किया, जहां तक मैंने सुना । शायद गलत सुना हो । हमने कोई फौरेन हैंड अपना कहीं डाला नहीं है ।

और जहां तक जो दूसरी बात आपने कही उसके बारे में अभी पंजाब पर जब यहां बहस हुई तो उस पर भी मैंने जवाब दिया था कि इन जातों का कोई बहुत फूल प्रूफ ऐवीडेंस, फूलप्रूफ सबूत कभी नहीं मिलता है । जहां दूसरे देशों में भी ऐसी बातें हुई हैं वहां भी उस समय कई लोगों को लगता था कि ऐसा हुआ है । लेकिन बहुत से लोगों ने इन्कार किया । आखिर में जब उनकी पुस्तक निकली और आर्टिकल्स इत्यादि जिकले तब जाकर पता चला कि ऐसा हुआ था । उसमें उस प्रकार का सबूत कभी होता नहीं है ।

PROF. K. K. TEWARY : The inducof sophisticated weaponry in our tion neighbourhood, particularly in Pakistan, poses a threat to our securty; and as our past experience shows, the weapons supplied by America had always been used against us. But what is frightening is the mounting evidence of collaboration between China and Pakistan in the nuclear field. And this has become all the more frightening in view of America-China collaboration in the field of nuclear know-how Has this aspect been gone into ? May I know whether the money supplied by CIA for training Mujaagainst Afghanistan is being hids used in these training camps are being used for training supporters of Khalistan movement and extremists in J & K?

SHR1MATI INDIRA GANDHI : I have no information about what and how money is being used. It is true that China—you must have read in the newspapers—has denied supplying any nuclear know-how. But American sources themselves are reporting that this is a fact.

Killing of Persons by Terrorists in Tripura

(b) In July 1984, seven persons were killed.

(c) 24 extremists have been apprehended by the security forces, so far, during 1984.

(d) According to the State Government of Tripura, intensive combined combing operations have been undertaken to nab the extremists. For border security duties and with a view to-prevent infiltration of insurgents into Tripura from across the border, the strength of the Central Security forces has been augmented.
