[Mr. Deputy-Speaker] The question is:

"This House recommends that a Committee consisting of seven members, not less than four of whom should be members of Parliament, be constituted to enquire into and report within six months

and Asian Nations in U.N.O. about the working of the Income Tax Department, with recommendations to improve the efficiency in the administration of the department leading to quick assessment and better results in revenue collections."

RESOLUTION RE. REPRESENTA-TION OF AFRICAN AND ASIAN NATIONS IN U.N.O.

Shri Brajeshwar Prasad (Gaya East): May I seek your permission to just move my Resolution and resume my seat, so that I can speak on it next time?

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: There is one difficulty. The old business could be continued without a specific extension of the sitting; but, if a new business is to be taken up, the House would have to give its approval for a definite extension of the sitting. There ought

to be a specific extension of the s ting up to 5-30 P.M. Does the Hou approve of it?

Several Hon, Members: Yes.

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: The sitting extended up to 5-30 P.M.

Shri Brajeshwar Prasad: I beg move:

"This House recommends to the Government of India to press for the revision of the Charter of the United Nations so that Africar and Asian nations may be represented in the U.N.O. in propor tion to their population and tha

all the representatives and delegates in the U.N.O. and its subsidiary bodies be elected on the basis of adult franchise."

Before I commence my main arguments, I would like to place certain facts and figures before the House. Europe has got 27 representatives in the U.N.O. and Asia has got 20 representatives. The population of Europe is 57 crores and odd whereas the population of Asia is what is called one arab in Hindi and 36 crores.

Shri A. M. Thomas (Ernakulam): How can it be 36 crores? India alone has got a population of 36 crores.

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: He said, "136 crores".

Shri Brajeshwar Prasad; According to the standard of representation which is prevailing in Europe, we should have 64 seats, Africa should get only 10 seats, North America should get 11 seats; South America should get 6 seats; Australasia should get no seats.

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: The hon. Member may continue next ime. The House stands adjourned till 11 A.M. tomorrow.
