MOTION RE: INTERNATIONAL SITUATION

The Prime Minister and Minister of External Affairs (Shri Jawaharial Nehra): Mr. Speaker, I beg to move:

"That the present International Situation and the policy of the Government of India in relation thereto, be taken into consideration."

We had a debate on the international situation and foreign affairs in August last, i.e. nearly four ago. These four months have considerable and significant developments. From the time we discussed last, we have before us this important change that has occurred in West Asia, that is, in Iraq, where a revolution had taken place and the monarchy had been displaced by a republic. Fairly intimately connected with it was the situation in Lebanon. and that situation became worse and there was the landing of foreign troops both in Lebanon and in Jordan. Fortunately, the situation was controlled and ultimately the foreign troops were taken away.

In this connection, I should like to refer to the work of the United Nations Commission in Lebanon, because I do think that that Commission performed a remarkably fine piece of work there and it was largely due to that Commission that tragic developments were avoided. May also mention in this connection name of the Indian member of that Commission, Shri Rajeshwar Dayal. to whom I should like to pay my tribute, knowing as I do the good work he did in this Commission in Lebanon<sup>7</sup> As the House knows, he had been appointed our High Commissioner for Pakistan,
