Shri Hem Barua: How are we to bring it up here then?

CALLING ATTENTION TO MATTER OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE

DIFFICULTIES IN STEEL PLANTS IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR DUE TO IRREGULAR SUPPLY OF COAL AND LIME-STONE

Shri Naushir Bharucha (East Khandesh): Under Rule 197, I beg to call the attention of the Minister of Steel, Mines and Fuel to the following matter of urgent public importance and I request that he may make a statement thereon:—

"The difficulties faced by the Steel Plants in the Private Sector due to irregular supply of coal and limestone and the steps taken to remedy the situation.".

The Minister of Steel, Mines and Fuel (Sardar Swaran Singh): Sir, may I place the statement on the Table of the House?
