SHRI PARIPOORNANAND PAINULLI: The hon. Minister, in his reply, just now said that the Planning Commission has addressed the U.P. Government. May I know whether the U.P. Government proposals had been accepted *in toto*? If so, whether some of the public sector projects would be given to the three most backward areas in Bundelkhand and Eastern U.P.

SHRI D. P. DHAR: I never said that we have had any discussions about the U.P. Plans. And therefore, the question, in my humble opinion, does not arise.

MR. SPEAKER: It is a question of general nature.

SHRI D. BASUMATARI: In view of the fact that since independence many of the public sector undertakings are in backward areas—mainly in the tribal areas—and since members of scheduled tribes have been ousted from their homes hear this, I want to know categorically from the hon. Minister whether, while planning any project in the Fifth Plan, these people would get rehabilitation assistance and land for land? In the planning itself they must have this included.

SHRI D. P. DHAR: Whenever a project displace the local population in the place where the project is located, the first charge on the project the first charge on the industry and the first charge on the Government would be the rehabilitation of those who are dislocated.

SHRI NAWAL KISHORE SHARMA: In practice, it does not happen.

SHRI PILOO MODY: Does he say that it had happened in the past?

SHRI D. P. DHAR: I was talking of the Fifth Five Year Plan. And

this principle would be strictly adhered to, as far as the Planning Commission is concerned.

SHRI PILOO MODY: If he is there then.

SHRI D. P. DHAR: He may be there to carry on the talks.

Cut in the Size of Fifth Plan for U.P.

*148. **SHRI R. K. SINHA:** Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Planning Commission has indicated a slashing of about Rs. 1500 crores in the draft Fifth Plan of Uttar Pradesh and if so, the reasons for this cut; and

(b) whether the Central Government would reconsider their decision in view of Uttar Pradesh's backwardness?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (SHRI MOHAN DHARIA): (a) and (b). The Uttar Pradesh Government has sent the draft Fifth Plan proposals for consideration of the Planning Commission. A final view regarding the size of the State's Fifth Plan will be taken after discussions with the State Government and after considering all relevant factors.

SHRI R. K. SINHA: The hon. Minister has not replied to my question. It was reported in the press also that a sum of Rs. 1500 crores had been deducted from what was proposed for the next Five Year Plan for U.P. Is it not also a fact that UP has been successfully ignored in the previous Five Year Plans, and in fact, U.P. a one Plan behind the national average in the country in *per capita* development? I would like to know whether the Planning Commission would like UP to continue to be a drag on the national economy, and whether a growth of less than 10 per cent in UP will not perpetuate backwardness in U.P.

THE MINISTER OF PLANNING (SHRI D. P. DHAR): Our difficulty at the present moment is that we have not discussed the proposals for the Fifth Five Year Plan from U.P. at all. But I would like to assure hon. Members that the special circumstances and the backwardness of U.P. will be taken into account while determining the investment pattern for that State

SHRI R. K. SINHA: The hon. Minister has taken a formalistic view of the problem, because the discussions have taken place; it may be that they may be at the proposal stage. In U.P., out of 1,12,624 villages, only 24,800 villages have been electrified. It is in the worst ladder of backwardness, Industrial backwardness, unemployment and agricultural backwardness give it a backward place in the whole nation. I would also like to say that the maximum number of backward districts are from UP. I would also like to say that the hill areas of UP, the backward areas of UP, especially eastern UP have become so backward that even the number of MLAs from these areas associated for delimiting the constituencies is less. Our people are forced to go to Bombay and other places for jobs....

MR. SPEAKER: I would like to tell the hon. Member that this is the Question Hour and not a debate-hour.

SHRI R. K. SINHA: I am not debating, but I am putting my question. Even the population growth in the backward areas has come down, and the maximum number of backward districts is from UP. Will the Planning Commission see that these factors are also kept in view in the next plan and allocations are made for UP in the light of this?

SHRI D. P. DHAR: I did not give a formalistic answer or reply. It was a realistic reply in as much as we have not had the privilege and the

pleasure of discussing the proposals for the Fifth Plan with the UP Government. I do agree, however, with the hon. Member that in terms of development, perhaps UP would be one of those States which would take the first place in backwardness, and, therefore, as far as the Planning Commission is concerned, we shall make our best endeavours to see that this state of neglect is cured.

SHRI RANABAHADUR SINGH: In view of the Minister's reply, may I ask whether the state of Madhya Pradesh which has a preponderance of population of Adivasis would also be kept in mind as far as development of backward areas is concerned?

MR. SPEAKER: The question was about UP.

श्री अटल बिहारी वाजपेयी श्री मंत्री महादय न स्वीकार किया है कि उत्तर प्रदेश पिछडा हुआ है। इस पिछड हुा उत्तर प्रदेश से पूर्वी जिल और भी पिछड हुए है। योजना आयोग न एक पटेल कमिशन नियुक्त किया या उन पिछड डग क्षेत्रा को जाच के लिये और उन के विकास के लिये मुआव देने के लिये। क्या राजना मंत्री को मालूम हे कि वह पटेल कमिशन की रिपोर्ट रहा की टोकरी म फैंक दी गई है और उस पर अभी तक कोई अमल नही किया गया है ?

श्री डी० पी० शर मै श्री वाजपेयी म कहना चाहगा कि योजना मंत्री उत्तर प्रदेश से इतने नावाकिक नही है जितने वह समझन है। जहा तक यू पी की बैकवर्डनेस का ताल्लूक है उस के लिये खाम मन्त्रे बनाने जा रहे हैं। हमें उम्मीद है कि इस पाच नाना म सूत्रे मे जितने पिछडे डग इलाके हे चाहे वह उत्तर प्रदेश के हो चाहे बिहार के डो चाहे बुन्देलखण्ड डो या ईस्ट यू पी हो उन का खाम ख्याल रखा जायेगा ।

श्री डी० पी० शर हमें इन बातों की वाक-फिरन है और आप इस बात का इत्मानान रखें कि इन सब चीजों का ध्यान रखा जायेगा।
