THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI C SUBRAMANIAM) (a) and The internal purchable power of the rupee, as measured by movement, in the All India Working Class Index (1960=100) Consumer Price rose from 30 49 paise in terms of 1960 prices in June 1975 towards the end of which the Emergency was promulgated, to 33 56 paise in Tan lary 1976

(c) The value of the rupee m the international market need not necessarily show variations similar to the changes in its internal purchasing power since the exchange rate of the rupee is also affected by developments in the exchange markets abroad as well as m the exchange system. The new exchange rate system adopted from 25th September 1975 is designed to adjust the rupees exchange rate in response to both internal and external Accordingly the Re developments serve Bank has on 11th March 1976 refixed the middle rate for its cales and purchases of pound sterling at Rs 1725 which compares with the relatively lower rate of Rs 1880 March 1974
