SHRI P. GANGADEB: I would further like to know whether the orders placed by the ONGC on the USSR for supply of some sophisticated equipment for working out these Assam oil wells have been implemented. What is the present position of the works that are going ahead?

SHRI K. D. MALAVIYA: We have placed an order and an agreement has been reached for the supply of rigs from USSR so that we might increase the tempo of work in Assam. We hope that the rigs will arrive very shortly.

SHRI RAGHUNANDAN LAL BHA-TIA: The hon, Minister in his statement has said that there is an expanupto 1.2 million sion programme tonnes for 1975-76 and to the extent of 2.25 million tonnes in 1977-78. May I know from the hon. Minister if the necessary funds are available to finance these expansions?

SHRI K. D. MALAVIA: Yes, Sir.

SHRI P. G. MAVALANKAR: The hon. Minister in reply to part (c) and (d) said, "Yes, Sir". May I know whether he is in a position to say, at this stage, whether both the programmes mentioned in part (c) and (d) are meeting with any reasonable and, if so, what are those success areas in which success has been obtained and whether the explorations are taking place, besides Assam, in Gujarat and other parts of the country?

SHRI K. D. MALAVIYA: The success depends upon our ability to stick to the programme. We try to stick to the programme. Sometimes, we fail and we are not able to stick to the programme because of either logistic reasons or rigs not being available to us or some particular oil well is giving trouble and we have got to slow it down. We are trying to do our best. So far as Gujarat is concerned, Gujarat programme of exploration, according to my personal view. is going on quite well.

MR. SPEAKER: The Question isabout Assam.

SHRI TARUN GOGOI: I would like to know from the hon. Minister whether, in view of the additional availability of crude oil in Assam, provision has been made to refine it within that State by setting up another refinery or by expanding the existing refinery at Gauhati or the proposed refinery at Bongaigaon.

SHRI K. D. MALAVIA: It has already been answered by me. We are trying our best to examine the possibility of expansion of the two refineries and if it is possible, we shall certainly do it.
