Expansion of Nepa Mills

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRIAL DEVE-LOPMENT (SHRI M. B. RANA): (a) and (b). A scheme to increase the production of Nepa Mills from 30,000 tonnes to 75,000 tonnes per annum is under implementation and is expected to be completed within a year.

Quick Delivery of Telegrams in State Capitals
