**Assistance to University Teachers  
from Bangla Desh**

\*113. DR. RANJEN SEN. Will the Minister of EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHIKSHA AUR SAMAJ KALYAN MANTRI) be pleased to state:

(a) whether a large number of college and university teachers from Bangla Desh have temporarily migrated to India and have applied for appointment as teachers in various Indian Universities and College; and

(b) if so, whether Government have made any attempt to help those applicant teachers in regard to getting jobs in college?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION & SOCIAL WELFARE AND MINISTER OF DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE (SHIKSHA AUR SAMAJ KALYAN MANTRI AUR SANSKRITI VIBHAG MANTRI SHRI SIDDHARISHA SHANKAR RAY):

(a) & (b) One of the most unfortunate consequences of the violent atrocities committed by the Pakistan army in Bangla Desh has been a large exodus of economists, university professors, college and school teachers, artists and other intellectuals from Bangla Desh to India. Government is endeavouring to collect the number of such intellectuals and the respective areas of their competence. According to the information furnished by the Vice-Chancellor, Calcutta University as on 21-5-1971, 90 university teachers and 700 college teachers had applied to him for employment here. Many of these teachers and professors have expressed a desire to work in fields relevant to the future of their country. This matter is under the consideration of the Government and no final decision has been taken. It is not a question of giving these teachers and professors employment in India or maintenance allowance

but of finding out avenues for useful work.

**Deficit Budgets of States for the  
Year 1971-72**

Will the MINISTER OF FINANCE (VITTA MANTRI) be pleased to state :

(a) whether most of the State Governments have left uncovered large deficits in their budgets for the year 1971-72 and if so, the total amount of such deficits, Statewise ;

(b) whether Government have ever impressed upon the States the need to put their finances in order and the ways and means suggested to them to improve upon the position ; and

(c) the reaction of the State Governments thereto ?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (VITTA MANTRI) (SHRI YESHWANT-RAO) (a) : A statement is laid on the Table of House.

(b) and (c) : The Government of India have from time to time been urging all States to keep their budgetary position under constant review so as to avoid persistent deficits which results from imbalance between expenditure commitments and available resources. The State Governments are fully aware that they cannot except any assistance to cover their deficits, beyond the special accommodation (by way of loans) agreed to in respect of gaps in resources which are assessed by the Planning Commission to be inescapable in nature.

A large number of States have presented only vote-on-account budgets so far. The budgetary position in the States will, therefore, be clear only after the final budgets have been presented,
