(b) if so, the amount involved in purchasing these ships; and

(c) the total foreign exchange implication of the project ?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMEN-TARY AFFAIRS, AND SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SANSIDYA KARYA TATHA NAUWAHAN AUR PARIVAHAN MANTRI) (SHRI RAJ BAHADUR): (a) to (c). Government of India do not acquire ships themselves but they approve proposals submitted by Shipping Companies.

During 1970-71, the acquisition of 26 vessels of 6.05 lakhs GRT costing Rs. 163.44 crores was approved by Government. After 1.4.1971, acquisition of 3 more vessels of 1.51 lakhs GRT has also been approved at a cost of about Rs. 15'00 crores. Proposals submitted by 4 shipping companies for acquisition of 6 vessels with 2.76 lakhs GRT costing approximately Rs. 59 crores, all of it being payable in foreign exchange, are under various stages of consideration.

*144. SHRI JADEJA : Will the Minister of EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHIKSHA AUR SAMAJ KALYAN MANFRI) be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government have urged the Kendriya Vidyalayas to switch over to the Hindi medium from the new acidemic year;

(b) whether this directive of the Central Government has caused resentment among parents and teachers of non-Hindi regions particularly Ketala State; and

(c) If so, the reaction of Central Government thereto?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHIKSHA AUR SAMAJ KALYAN MANTRALAYA MEN UP-MANTRI) (SHRI D. P. YADAVA) : (a) to (c). No, Sir. No such directive has been issued by the Government. However, in April, 71, reports appeared in some scotions of the Press giving an impression that Union Ministry has issued directives, which would lead to the conversion of the Kendriya Vidyalayas into completely Hindi-medium Schools. Since this was not factually correct, a 'Press Note' was issued immediately contradicting the false reports.

Agreement for Imports under PL. 480 Programme

*145. DR. SARADISH ROY (SIIRI M. M. JOSEPH :

Will the Minister of FINANCE (VITTA MANTRI) be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government have signed another PL. 480 agreement covering commodities worth \$ 120 million in April, 1971;

(b) if so, the main features thereof ;

(c) whether Government propose to take positive steps to stop dependence on 480 imports which play an increasing role in our economic affairs; and

(d) if not, the reasons therefor ?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (VIITA MANTRI) (SHRI YESWANT RAO CHAVAN): (a) and (b). Yes, Sir. A statement containing a note giving main features of the Agreement is laid on the Table of the House. Copies of the Agreement have been placed in the Libra'y of the Parliamet separately for the information of the Hon'ble Members.

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Written Answers

(c) and (d): Yes, Sir. Government have already announced their decision to stop concessional import of foodgrains after end of 1971. Import of cotton and soyabean oil will however have to be continued for some years because of the large gap between indigenous production of cotton and edible oils and the growing needs of the economy. Efforts are being made to increase the internal production of these commodities also as quickly as possible.

Statement

Main features of the PL, 480 Agreement signed on 1-4-1971 as amended.

A PL. 480 Agreement was signed with the US Govt. on 1st April, 1971 for the supply of Agricultural Commodities from that country. The value of this Agreement was slightly increased in May 1971 (from \$ 150.00 million to \$ 158.3 million). Taken with these additions, the agreement provides for an import of 15,70,000 tonnes of wheat, 250,000 Indian bales of cotton (200,000 bales in terms of US bales) and 102,000 tonnes of soyabean oil valued at \$ 158.3 million. About 80% of the imports do not require rupce payment ; these will be under what are called Convertible Local Currency Credit Terms i. e. repayable in dollars over a period of 40 years, including a grace period of 10 years. The remaining 20% imports will be paid for in rupees, which rupees in turn have been earmarked for loan to Govt. of India 93°_{\circ} , and US uses 7°_{\circ} . Both the dollar and the rupees loan will carry interest at $2^{0/2}_{0}$ during the first 10 years and 3% during the subsequent 30 years.

2. The Agreement further allows the U.S. to convert \$ 7.5 million from the rupees earmarked for their uses into third country currencies for agricultural and educational exchange activities and for sale to U.S. tourists and citizens in India.
