Unemployment due to Green Revolution  
and Mechanisation of Agriculture

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be  
pleased to state :

(a) whether there has been an increase  
in unemployment due to the Green Revolu-  
tion and mechanisation of Agriculture;  
and

(b) if so, the steps Government have  
taken in this regard ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE  
MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI  
ANNASAHEB P. SHINDE) : (a) No,  
Sir. The term "Green Revolution" is  
generally being used for the success of  
New Strategy of Agriculture Develop-  
ment adopted since 1966-67. The implemen-  
tation of this New Agricultural Strategy  
consisting of High Yielding Varieties and  
Multiple Cropping Programmes has  
increased the intensity of farming and thus  
created more employment opportunities in-

spite of the partial mechanisation of  
Agriculture.

Central Grants to States for Integrated  
Dry Land Agricultural Development

provided to the States according to the  
Scheme, for the Integrated Dry Land  
Agricultural Development during the last  
two years, State-wise;

(b) whether any of the States have  
approached for more loans and grants to  
the Union Government; and

(c) if so, the main features thereof and  
action taken thereon ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE  
MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI  
ANNASAHEB P. SHINDE) : (a) An  
amount of Rs 190 66 lakhs was provision-  
ally released to the State Governments  
for the Integrated Dry Land Agricultural  
Development Scheme during the last two  
years, subject to adjustments on the  
basis of the audited figures of expenditure.  
State-wise break-up is given below :
