Unemployment due to Green Revolution and Mechanisation of Agriculture

- (a) whether there has been an increase in unemployment due to the Green Revolution and mechanisation of Agriculture; and
- (b) if so, the steps Government have taken in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI ANNASAHEB P. SHINDE): (a) No, Sir. The term "Green Revolution" is generally being used for the success of New Strategy of Agriculture Development adopted since 1966-67 The implementation of this New Agricultural Strategy consisting of High Yielding Varieties and Multiple Cropping Programmes has increased the intensity of farming and thus created more employment opportunities in-

spite of the partial mechanisation of Agriculture.

SHINDE): (a) An amount of Rs 190 66 lakhs was provisionally released to the State Governments for the Integated Dry Land Agricultural Development Scheme during the last two years, subject to adjustments on the basis of the audited figures of expenditure.
