Unified Syllabus in Universities

961. SHRI PALAIK.M. MATHEW: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DE-VELOPMENT (SHRI CHIMANBHAI MEHTA): (a) and (b). According to information furnished by University Grants Commission, the Commission initiated in 1986 the scheme of Curricular Development Centres to prepare model curriculum in different disciplines. The main objective was to develop curriculum packages in a modular form so that there would be an element of uniformity in the content of courses throughout the country which would also facilitate mobility of students. 27 such centres, 10 in sciences and 17 in humanities and social sciences. were set up by the Commission. Model curricula has so far been prepared for 24 disciplines in undergraduate and post-graduate courses and 19 have already been circulated to the universities for consideration and implementation.
