The Minister of Education (Dr. Triguna Sen) (a) The three-language formula as adopted by the Chief Ministers' Conference in 1961 is —

- Mother-tongue/Regional language
- 2 Hindi (for those whose mothertongue is Hindi, any other modern Indian language) and
- 3 English or any other language

This formula has been accepted in principle by all States except Madras where the formula is as follows—

- Mother-tongue/regional language.
- 2 English or any other foreign language
- 3 Hindi or any other modern Indian language or the language taken under (1) and its literature (advanced level).

In the non-Hindi States, the wast majority of students study, in practice.
