Trade with Afghanistan

*714. Shri K. P. Singh Deo: Will the Minister of Commerce be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are aware that Pakistan is sending a trade delegation to Afghanistan to boost her trade:
- (b) if so, whether visit of the Pakistani trade delegation will have any effect on the Indian trade in Afghanistan; and
- (c) if so, the reaction of Government thereto?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Dinesh Singh): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c). The bulk of our trade with Afghanistan is on barter Afghanistan basis. Imports from be required to counterare of Indian by balanced export goods of equivalent value to that country. We are aware of Pakistan's efforts to increase trade with Afghanistan. Pakistan's insistence on the diversion of Indo-Afghanistan Trade except fresh fruits from Afghanistanvia Karachi is adding to the cost of transport of our goods to Afghanistan. However we have to make every effort possible to meet the competition.
