Foreign Collaboration

*287. SHRI HARDAYAL **DEVGUN:** SHRI D.R. PARMAR: SHRI K.P. SINGH DEO: SHRI RABI RAY:

Will the Minister of INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT, INTERNAL TRADE AND COMPANY AFFAIRS be pleased to state :

- (a) whether it is a fact that Government have decided to allow foreign collaboration even in low priority and non-essential fields of industry:
 - (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the reasons for the change in policy in regard thereto?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT INTERNAL TRADE AND COMPANY AFFAIRS (SHRI F.A. AHMED): (a) to (c). Foreign collaboration is normally not allowed in low priority and non-essential fields of industry. However, as a part of the measures to promote exports of nontraditional industrial products from India, Government have recently decided that a relaxation may be made in the above policy where the foreign collaborator agrees to under-write a major share of the production for exports.

Labour Trouble in Durgapur Steel Plant

- (a) whether it is a fact that throughout the year 1968, there were persistent labour troubles at the Durgapur Steel Plant:

THE MINISTER OF STEEL AND HEAVY ENGINEERING (SHRI C.M. POONACHA): (a) and (b). labour situation, although better in 1968 compared to what it was in 1967, has not been satisfactory. The main reason is the inter-union rivalry between the Hindustan Steel Workers Union and the Hindustan Steel Employees Union;

(c) A Grievances Procedure is in existence and any genuine grievances of the employees are always given the fullest consideration.
