(a) to (e): Government of India through Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) is implementing Ethanol Blended Petrol (EBP) Programme, wherein ethanol is being blended in petrol to achieve the objectives of reducing import dependence, promote clean fuel and provide boost to agriculture. Studies were carried out by Automotive Research Association of India (ARAI) and Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL) to establish the vehicle performance of 10% ethanol blended petrol (E10). Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), after consultation with concerned stakeholders, issued fuel specification for E10 blending in 2014. Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas (MoP&NG) vide notification dated 5th February, 2019 directed OMCs to sell 10% ethanol blended petrol as per BIS specifications.
