Outlay on Cotton Development during Fourth Plan

*488. SHRI S. S. KOTHARI : Will the Minister of FOOD AND AGRICULTURE be pleased to state :

(a) whether a sum of Rs. 8.4 crores was to be made available for financing cotton development schemes in the remaining four years of the Fourth Plan period;

(b) whether, subsequently, Government decided not to make available this amount for cotton development;

(c) if so, the reasons therefor; and

(d) the actual amount which Government propose to spend on cotton development in 1970-71 and other years of the Fourth Plan ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD, AGRICULTURE, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND CO-OPERATION (SHRI ANNASAHIB SHINDE) : (a) to (c). A proposal for an additional sum of Rs. 8.4 crores for cotton was considered by the Planning Commission but was not agreed to. The outlay of Rs. 390 lakhs during the 4th Plan was considered sufficient.

(d) The budget provision for Cotton Centrally Sponsored Scheme during 1970-71 is Rs. 89.85 lakhs. The proposed outlay for 1971-72 is Rs. 209 lakhs. Details regarding financial outlay for 1972-73 and 1973-74 have not been worked out.
