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SHRI K. RAGHU RAMAIAH: The bon. member said that since this brother has become the Minister, the water has become scarce in Delhi. May I inform him that my earlier brothers also had the same difficulty?

Regarding the shortage of water, we are cartainly having complaints about the shortage for a long time, long before my accession to this gaddi from parts of, Ramakrishnapuram, parts of Moti Bagah Malaviya Nagar, Srinivaspuri and Janakpuri, because some of them are at tailend also because of their elevation, in my answer, I have already indicated that we are, at present, able to supply only 193 million gallons of water per day whereas the requirement now is of the order of 48g million gallons per day at the rate of 50 gallons per head.

SHRIMATI T. LAKSHMIKANTHA-MMA: Delhi is such a vast growing city. It is not only supply of more quantity of water but also of clean water. The sewage is let into the Jammuna river. Whenever one drinks water, one has a feeling that one is drinking gutter water. May I know from the hon. Minister whether there is any plant to make water more clean and see that the sewage is divereted and not let into the Jammuna river?

SHRI K. RAGHU RAMAIAH: Regarding the question raised by the hon. Member, sometime back there have been complaints in the past about the Jamuna river water getting pollluted at Wazirabad and Okhla Water Works. As regards Wazirabad Water Works, the sewage problem has already been solved by constructing a barrage at a cost of Rs. 12 crores. No sewage water now enters the Jamuna river at Wazirabad barrage and that quality of water in this place is maintained at a high standard.

SHR K. RAGHU RAMAIAH: This also relates to a narticular area which falls in the same category as that on which a question has been put from this side.

भी मूलकार डावा : फिल्टर्ड वाटर आपने जितना बताया है, अन-फिल्टर्ड वाटर की भी उतनी ही कमी है । अन फिल्टर्ड काटर आग-बनी को सीर सान में दिया जाता है से जिल्ल फिल्टर्ड वाटर उसकी जगह भी काम में लिया जाता है । क्या मंत्री अहोदय अन-फिल्ट्ड् वाटर की ज्यादा व्यवस्था कर सकेने जिससे फिल्टर्ड वाटर पोने के लिए लोगों को ज्यादा मिल सके । मोना बाग के एम ज्योज को भो पोने के लिए पानी नहीं मिलता है, इस संबंध में क्या व्यवस्था कर रहे हैं ।

SHR. K. RAGHU RAMAIAH: Everay conceivable step is being taken to increase the potable water supply.

## Import of Rice from U.S.A. under PL-480

\*714. SHRI K. M. MADHUKAR† : SHRI K. LAKKAPPA :

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION be pleased to rtate:

- (a) whether U.S. Government have rejected the proposal to give rice to India under PL-480; and
- (b) if so, the facts thereof and Governments' reaction thereto?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE & IRRIAGTION (SHRI ANNASAHEB P. SHINDE): (a) and (b) Government of India did not make any proposal to the US Government for supply of rice under PL-480. There were, however, some discussions between the two Governments on the possibilty of supply of one lakh tonnes of rice to India. it was decided not to include supply of rice in the agreement. The final agreement concluded on 20th March, 1975, was for the supply of 8 lakh tonnes of wheat only.

SHRI ANNASAHEB P. SHINDE: I do not apreciate the feeling of the Hon'ble Member in this regard. We may have differences with USA on other issues, about which we have taken a firm position even countries like China and Russia purchase foodgrains from USA in their National interest. But as far as the national interest is concerned, we purchase from all countries, including USA. This should not come in our dealings with USA or any country.

SHRI ANNASAHLB P. SHINDE: We are exploring the possibilities from Burma, Trailand and Egyht. Still the picture is not very clear because the prices of international markets are very high and, therefore, we are having some difficulties. Even the availability picture is not clear.

SHRI ANNASAHLB P. SHINDE: We are attending to the production programme and, in fact, rice production is going up. This year, the difficulties are there as important rice growing areas in Madhya Pradesh, Orissa and Iamilnadu are having a severe drought. That is why there was a set-back in rice producion.

SHRI CHINTAMANI PANIGRAHI: May I know from the Hon'ble. Minister as he has stated that there are serious drought conditions in the rice producing States like Orissa and other regions, whether the Government has assessed the actual requirements of rice for the year 1975-76 and, if so, what would be the real shortage, so that, at last from May onwards, if there is a demand from rice growing States for rice, the Government can know whether it is in a position to meet the demand from Stateslike Orissa which are suffering from drought?

SHRI ANNASAHEB P. SHINDE : This question is regarding import of rice.

SHRI CHINTAMANI PANIGRAHI: I wanted to know whether the Government has assessed the requirements so that we may import rice.

MR. SPEAKER: Don't ask farfetched questions which have no relevance to the main question.

SHRI CHINTAMANI PANIGRAHI:
May I ask how much rice the Government
wants to import—if not from USA, from
different countreles?

MR. SPLAKER: Kindly sit down it is not essential to make out another question. This is a very categorical question whether the U.S. Government have rejected the proposal.

SHRI SAMAR GUHA: I want to know from the Government whether a deduction can be drawn from the policy of import of foodgrains from foreign countries in regard to wheat and rice-fit m the figures it will be seen that, during the last ten years, the import of rice is gradually coming to nil; last year it was almost nil-

MR. SPLAKER: The main Question seeks factual information whether the U.S. Government have rejected the proposal to give rice to India under PL-480. Why should the other matters be brought here?

SHRI SAMAR GUHA: Allright, Sir. I have my call-attention motion when I will raise it.
