#### LICENCING POLICY FOR AYURVEDIC MEDICINES

Will the Minister of AYURVEDA, YOGA AND NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY (AYUSH) be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has any proposal to revamp the existing licencing policy for AYUSH medicines;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (c) the details of existing AYUSH treatment facilities in Bihar?

### **ANSWER**

# THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYURVEDA, YOGA & NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY (SHRI SHRIPAD YESSO NAIK)

(a) & (b): Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940 and Drugs & Cosmetics Rules, 1945 have exclusive provisions for regulation, quality control and manufacturing of Ayurvedic, Siddha, Unani and Homoeopathic (ASU&H) medicines under license. Central Government makes and amends these provisions in consultation with the respective Drugs Technical Advisory Board following a stipulated procedure and the State Governments are responsible to enforce these provisions including grant and renewal of license for manufacturing ASU&H medicines. As of now, Ministry of AYUSH in collaboration with National Informatics Centre, is developing e-aushadhi portal to introduce online licensing system for ASU&H medicines manufacturers in the states.

(c): As per available information, following are the details of existing AYUSH treatment facilities in Bihar state-

In addition, 1384 AYUSH facilities are co-located in District Hospitals and other health centres under National Health Mission.

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
